



We are excited that you have chosen Compleat KiDZ Psychology and Behavioral Therapy Services to begin the process of identifying and implementing a strategy to help your child gain the skill sets needed to overcome their behavioral challenges.

To get started, we need you to review and sign our ABA Informed Consent form, which gives us your permission to begin providing services to your child under the stipulations stated herein.

The first step in this process involves working with our Psychology Team. This will include gathering background information about your child and family, including medical, psychiatric, developmental, and educational histories, and then performing some psychological testing to determine what is the source of and contributing factors to your child's behavioral challenges. During this assessment you are encouraged to share your concerns and hopes for your child. This process will guide us in making recommendations about the range and scope of services that would support treatment. If your child has previously had a psychological evaluation completed by a Clinical Psychologist or a Developmental Pediatrician in the last year, portions or possibly all aspects of this step may not be required. We would need to receive a copy of the previous Psychology Evaluation so that it can be reviewed. If deemed insufficient, we will recommend that your child participates in the process outlined above.

The next step is dependent upon the outcome of the Psychology Evaluation. If your child is diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder (ASD), most likely we will recommend a treatment approach of Behavioral Therapy. This is often called ABA Therapy. Prior to the commencement of ABA Therapy an ABA Evaluation is conducted in-person by one of our Board-Certified Behavioral Analysts (BCBA). This evaluation will be the basis for developing your child's ABA Treatment Plan for the initial 6 months of treatment.

Compleat KiDZ does have an early intervention ABA Program that we will recommend to you if your child meets the requirements of our program. If they do not, then we will provide some suggestions for other programs in the community that are a better fit for your child. Even if we recommend our program, your child is not obligated to participate in our Behavioral Therapy Program, you may access these services from another provider of your choice.

If it is determined that your child is not appropriate for participation in our ABA Program, we will provide you with our recommendations for what interventions could be helpful at this time.
